



Crèmeschnitte Chörli Covid Guidelines

Updated version - November 2021

The Covid pandemic continues to pose a serious health risk to the community even though a large percentage of the ACT's population has been vaccinated. Covid-19 variants may become an ongoing issue.

The Swiss choir undertakes to abide fully by the principles and requirements detailed in the Harmonie German Club's Covid-19 Safety Plan.

In particular, please continue to follow these guidelines:

Register via the QR code

- Patrons visiting the Club are asked to scan the QR code at the front door or reception desk.

Follow Medical Health Advice

- Do not visit the Club if:
 - you experience flu-like symptoms
 - you are from or have visited anyone from a known hotspot
 - you have been in contact with anyone showing symptoms of Covid-19.

Maintain Good Hygiene

- Hand sanitising stations are easily accessible - PLEASE USE THEM.
- Frequently touched areas are cleaned regularly with sanitising agents.

Physical Distancing

- Continue to maintain physical distancing wherever possible.

Choral practice by nature carries a higher risk for spreading airborne diseases, therefore these additional choir-specific rules should be followed during rehearsals:

- Choristers are responsible for assessing their own health. Anyone who is not feeling 100% well is asked NOT to come to rehearsals.
- Sanitise your hands on entering the Keller and try to avoid touching surfaces unnecessarily.
- Keep to social distancing rules as much as you can.
- Chairs will be set up at a safe distance from the conductor and pianist, and spaced out so that choristers are not sitting too close to each other.
- Mask-wearing is optional (but not really practical while singing).
- Sheet music is generally only handed out by the musical director. Any sheet music given to choir members will remain the property of choristers and should not be returned to the library. Music sheets should not be shared between choristers.
- Adequate ventilation will be provided by opening doors/windows whenever possible.
